The **NDUS Accountability Measures Report for 2013** is currently under construction

The NDUS mandated requirements go back to 1999 when the legislative Interim Higher Education Committee was expanded by the Legislative Council to become the Roundtable on Higher Education, a group of state leaders from the public and private sectors who established new expectations for the NDUS. In 2001, SB 2003 was passed by the Legislative Assembly and the Roundtable members identified key cornerstones on which to build a university system for the 21st century. The Roundtable then developed accountability measures that would allow stakeholders and the NDUS to measure success in revitalizing the state's economy. The annual NDUS Accountability Measures report is widely used to determine how well Roundtable, Legislative, and State Board of Higher Education expectations are being met.

The North Dakota University System campuses assume responsibility to the NDUS for fulfilling Measures: ED1, EE 1, EE 2, EE 3, EE 4, EE 5, and EE 6 of the mandated economic development (ED) and the education excellence accountability (EE) measures. Each is listed separately below in the yellow cells. Reported data are to be placed in the green cells under each heading.
