Although now retired from full-time teaching, Sam Johnson continues to teach online classes for Lake Region State College as an associate professor of English and humanities on a part-time basis, while also conducting his own personal writing and research projects. Through the years Sam has held several positions at LRSC including Adjunct Professor, Curriculum and Grant Writing Associate, Associate Professor, and Instructional Design Coordinator. He served on the DL Carnegie Public Library board and was a member of DL Heim Lodge Sons of Norway and as an officer and member of the Lake Region Wood Carvers.
