Program Structure

The program will run Monday through Thursday, July 15 – 18, 2024, 12:55pm-5:05pm.

Sessions run from: ONE: 12:55-2:10pm, TWO: 2:15-3:30pm, THREE: 3:50-5:05pm.

Students are divided into classes by grade completed: Grades K-1-2 or Grades 3-4-5.

Students can choose to attend 1, 2, or all 3 sessions.
