

# EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

## 60 credit AAS | 30 credit Certificate

## THE PROGRAM

The Early Childhood Education program is an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree or can be completed in one year with our certificate program. The program teaches students the importance of human growth and development and child behaviors and how it affects their ages and stages of development. Students develop healthy communication skills necessary to positive relationships with children and parents.

Early childhood educators are needed in a variety of settings, including:

- Childcare facilities
- Recreation centers
- Pre-K schools & programs (Head Start)
- Private home childcare
- Other children's institutions

## A TRANSFER-FRIENDLY SYSTEM

Most universities across the country are considered "transfer-friendly" especially within the North Dakota University System (NDUS):

- AA degrees are commonly accepted in place of specific first and second year core requirements.
- GER - All first and second year (100 & 200 level) general education requirements have common names and numbers throughout the NDUS.
- We want to eliminate the chance of confusion about course equivalence.

## ADVISORS/TRiO & PowerSkills

Knowledgeable advisors will help you create a class schedule and choose electives to build strong foundations for upper division coursework and to meet transfer requirements.

## CHOOSE YOUR PATH

If you want to enter a 4-year college or university after LRSC, you should do your research.

- Gather catalogs from your 4-year choice schools.
- You and your advisor can create a course plan.
- Work with your advisor to meet prerequisites with your electives for the AA or AS degree.
- Check with Student Services about transfer agreements LRSC has with your 4-year choice.

3. GET RELEVANT WORK EXPERIENCE by participating in LRSC's Cooperative Education program to gain valuable hands-on work experience.



4. LINE UP YOUR INTERNSHIP (EC 297) EARLY to meet the 154-hour requirement needed for both the Certificate and the AAS degree.



5. STRENGTHEN YOUR JOB-SEEKING AND INTERVIEW SKILLS by enrolling in BADM 291 Career Seminar.

The certificate program is a one-year, fast-track program to prepare you for immediate entry-level employment working with young children in group settings such as child care centers or for starting a home business as a family child care provider.
