urt Hofstad and Annette Gette Hofstad were born and raised in Starkweather, North Dakota. Curt's farming roots go back four generations. Annette's parent's, Malior and Marie Zeigler Gette, also lived in Starkweather most of their married life, farming and raising fifteen children.

Curt and Annette's son, Chad, his wife, Allison, and their four children now live on the Hofstad family farm, carrying on the homestead farming tradition.

Annette and Curt's daughter, Nicole, lives in New York City, but despite the distance from her family's roots, has strong connections to her home through her artwork. Graduating from the Art Institute of New York City, Nicole conveys her love for her home through paintings and other visual arts. She also received a degree in marketing from the University of Baltimore.

Annette and Curt's other daughter, Shannon, and husband, Jerry, have been overseas in Germany but have now put down roots in Las Vegas, Nevada, with their two children. Shannon has a degree in public relations and teaches yoga.

Curt attended North Dakota State University earning degrees in math and economics. As a high school student, he earned a pilot's license and shared this passion by providing flying lessons while in college. Annette's dream to become a registered nurse took her to the city of Minot where she enrolled in St. Joseph's School of Nursing and Minot State University.

Annette came from a large family and knew that in order to make her dreams come true, she would have to work hard and pay for her own education. During summer months she worked at the K-B Café in Starkweather, and during the school year she often worked weekends as a student nurse. She also received scholarships and loans which enabled her to finish college and achieve her career goal.
