They ran the studio until their younger son, Reed, graduated from high school in 1999 when they sold their studio negative files and equipment to PJ Carlson Photography in Rock Lake.

Greg started North Central Wischek Disc Company in 1999 and turned that operation over to sons Travis and Reed, who renamed it T&R Sales in 2008. It is a short lines implementation dealership. Greg is currently a representative in the North Dakota Legislature. He has served many years on the Cando school board and the operation board for the Towner County Medical Center in Cando.

Janet is a registered nurse and retired in 2011 after a 45-year nursing career. She then worked as a consultant until November 2013 specializing as a nationally certified Resident Assessment Coordinator. Janet is currently involved with many volunteer organizations.

Greg and Janet have two sons. Travis is the older and is married to Natalie Simon. He is a graduate of UND, and they live at Hampden on the Simon farm. They have two sons, Garrett and Ian. Travis is a mechanical engineer and is currently farming. His wife Natalie works out of their home, keeping her job with Hayworth in Grand Rapids, Michigan, where they lived prior to moving back to North Dakota in 2005. Natalie has a master's degree in business. She has taught some LRSC online classes in the past.
