

LAW ENFORCEMENT & PEACE OFFICER TRAINING

60 credit AAS | 20 credit Certificate

THE PROGRAM

The Certificate in Peace Officer Training is a rigorous one-semester program that satisfies training requirements for employment as a peace officer in North Dakota. The four-semester Associate in Applied Science in Law Enforcement degree is a common requirement for advancement in law enforcement careers and meets the entrance requirement of several large agencies that require a two-year college education. Graduates of Lake Region State College's Law Enforcement and Peace Officer Training programs are actively recruited by the numerous law enforcement agencies in North Dakota.

Much of the coursework is taught in a hands-on manner, providing the candidates with a working knowledge of the performance of police tasks. Students will learn skills such as:

- Law of Arrest and Search and Seizure
- Crime Scene Processing
- Drug Crimes
- DUI Detection/Apprehension
- Emergency Vehicle Operations
- Evidence Collection and Fingerprinting
- Firearms
- Hazardous Materials
- High-Risk Traffic Stops

- Photography
- Physical Fitness
- Police Ethics and Tactics
- Radar/Ladar
- Radio Telecommunications
- Report Writing
- Rules of Evidence
- Traffic Law

PEACE OFFICER ACADEMY

The Peace Officer Training certificate may be completed as a stand-alone program or part of the two-year Law Enforcement program. Students who pursue the Associate in Applied Science in Law Enforcement degree generally enroll in the Peace Officer Training Program early in the semester before the course being offered. Students who complete the POTP first can complete the AAS in Law Enforcement either on-campus or online. The Program is an academy-style setting. Students have physical fitness training every morning while classroom hours are held 9-5 Monday through Friday.

The Devils Lake program is the only NDUS location that offers on-campus room and board for POTP students.

CHOOSE YOUR PATH

If you want to enter a 4-year college or university after LRSC, you should do your research.

- Gather catalogs from your 4-year choice schools.
- You and your advisor can create a course plan.
- Work with your advisor to meet prerequisites with your electives for the AA or AS degree.
- Check with Student Services about transfer agreements LRSC has with your 4-year choice.

Are you considering a bachelor's degree? LRSC and Minot State University have an articulation agreement to help students make a smooth transition into MSU's Criminal Justice degree. Talk to your academic advisor for more information about program requirements.

TIPS FOR STUDENT SUCCESS



1. SCHEDULE TIME WITH YOUR ADVISOR immediately after term schedules is published to choose courses for upcoming semesters. Your advisor will help you select courses that meet core requirements.



2. SAVE MONEY BY CARRYING A HEAVIER COURSE LOAD. Discuss with your advisor if a heavy course load works for you and your schedule.



3. GET YOUR APPLICATION IN EARLY. To qualify for entry into the Peace Officer Training Program, candidates must complete the program's application process which includes an extensive background check, and a physical and psychological exam.
